JUDGES 1-21 = WORD #15 (Sin is progressive - it always "wants more")

#SCRIPTURE READING: Different selections from Judges 1-21

#SERMON/INTRODUCTION: Real heroes are hard to find these days. Modern research and the media have made the foibles and weaknesses of our leaders very apparent; we search in vain for men/women to emulate. The music, movie & sports industries produce a steady stream of "stars" who shoot to the top - and then (as quickly) fade from our view.

+TRANSITION: Judges is *a book about heroes - 12 men/women who delivered Israel from their oppressors. These judges were not perfect; in fact - they included an assassin, a sexually promiscuous man, and a person who broke all the laws of hospitality. But they were submissive to God - and God used them...But Judges is also *a book about sin and its consequences. Like a minor cut or abrasion that becomes infected when left untreated - sin grows and soon poisons the whole body, with damaging consequences. The pattern of history in the book of Judges mirrors accurately the sort of lives many people live when they do not know God.

+EXEGESIS&APPLICATION: If you add together all the years that the 12 people mentioned in this part of Israel's history "judged" the nation, they come to ±400 years in total. And yet, historically/chronologically the book of Judges only covers a period of 250-300 years. How do we resolve this apparent problem? B/S, when we read about Gideon & Samson, we tend to think they were delivering the whole nation; but Israel was devided into groups of tribes, spread over a wide area (roughly the size of the Kruger National Park). Therefore, when we read a judge ruled for a period of 40 years, it may only apply to tribes in the north. While this was happening, it was possible that a judge was saving the situation in the south. We can distinguish 6 successive periods of oppression and deliverance - and the "careers" of 12 deliverers.

*The stories of the individuals within this book are certainly gripping: -

~ (1) Othniel (Caleb's younger brother) brought peace to his people for 40 years.

~ (2) <u>Ehud</u>, the left-handed leader, who concealed his 18-inch swordblade by strapping it to his right leg. Since most people were right-handed, it was customary to check the left-leg for weapons. Ehud was thus able to take his weapon into a meeting with the King of Moab - and plunge it into his belly! (80 years of peace)

~ (3) Shamgar (3:31) who killed 600 Philistines with an ox-goad (sweepstok). (Unrecorded)

- ~ (4) Deborah & Barak: Deborah was a prophetess (married to a certain Lappidoth). In Hebrew her name meant "Busy Bee" & Lappidoth "Flash". Being a prophetess, Deborah would sit underneath a palm tree (somewhere between Beth-El & Rama), listening to people's disputes. She then would settle the disputes by hearing the answer from the Lord. On an occasion (led by the Spirit) she told Barak to lead the people (10 000 men) to Mt Tabor into battle against Sisera (the commander of King Jabin's army), and God would deliver him and his men into Barak's hand. Barak refused to go into battle without her. (By the way: In Israel, then and today, senior officers always lead their troops into battle) God was angry with Barak's refusal and told him that the enemy/Sisera would fall to the hand of a woman in order to humiliate him. And so it proved. (40 years of peace)
- ~ (5) Gideon (JUDGES 6-8): In wanting "to confirm his calling", he put some meat on an altar, and fire that rose out of the rock consumed up the meat. Then he asked the Lord for another sign as if the fire from heaven wasn't enough! God graciously provided it through a fleece which was dry one day and wet the next... However, Gideon had to learn that it is by God's strength that battles are won. Preparing him to attack the 135 000 Midianites, God reduced his army from 32 000 to 300 @ Ein-Harod = the well of Harod. (40 years of peace)

~ Abimelech: Not seen/regarded as a judge.

- ~ (6) <u>Tola</u>: He receives the brief comment that he led Israel for <u>23 years</u>.
- ~ (7) After him, <u>Jair</u> led Israel for <u>22 years</u>. Had 30 sons who, we are told (10:3-4), rode 30 donkeys & controlled 30 towns (in the Gilead area). A little interesting detail, but nothing more!
- ~ (8) <u>Jephtath</u> (head of Gilead): He made the rash vow that he would sacrifice to the Lord whatever came to meet him when he returned from battle and ended up having to sacrifice his only daughter. (6 years of peace)
- ~ (9) <u>Ibzan</u> (from Bethlehem): Had 30 sons & 30 daughters. All married outside the Judah clan. (7 years of peace)
- ~ (10) Elon led Israel for 10 years.
- ~ (11) Abdon: Had 40 sons&30 grandsons, each of whom had his own donkey. (8 years peace)
- ~ (12) <u>Samson</u>: He was a Nazirite, killed a lion with his bare hands, burned the Philistine wheat fields (tying torches to the tails of a 150 pair of jackal=300), killed a 1000 Philistines with a don-key's jawbone, tore off the iron gate of a city, was betrayed by Delilah and killed thousands of Philistines in one last mighty act. (20 years of peace)

*How did these less than perfect people manage to achieve so much? It was not through their own power. Their "secret" was that the Holy Spirit came on them - they were all "charismatic" leaders. (Greek:charismata=gifts) Judges gives us vivid examples of divine strength working through weak people. NB: The Holy Spirit came on only a few in the OT. Here, during this period, only 12 out of a possible 2 million experienced this annointing. We note too that the Holy Spirit came on them temporarily - nót permanently. For example - the text states that the HS léft Samson (13:25/14:6,19/16:20b). In the OT it was an annointing Spirit that touched them for a time/while, rather than an indwelling Spirit Who stayed with them.

*Possible that Samson was a "picture of the coming Messiah/Jesus Christ"? Type&Shadow:-

- ~ (1) Their births were foretold by an angel: S = JUDGES 13:2-3 / JC = LUKE 1:26-31.
- ~ (2) The angel told the mother first only then the father: S = 13:11 / JC = LUKE 1:26.
- ~ (3) Both were sent to deliver their people: S = 15:20 / JC = ROM 11:25-26.
- ~ (4) Both were Nazarite/Nazarine: S = 13.5 / JC = LUKE 1.26.
- ~ (5) Both spoke in riddles, parables and secrets: S = 14:12 / JC = MATT 13:34-35.
- ~ (6) Both chose (the) gentiles: S = 14:1-4 / JC (rejected by his own bride) = ACTS 13:44-48.
- ~ (7) Samson grew 7 locks = 16:13 / JC had the "7 spirits of the Lord on Him" = ISIAH 11:2 & REV 1:1-8, 5:6.
- ~ (8) Both were betrayed by a friend: S (Delilah) = chapter 16 / JC (Judas) = JOHN 13:21-30
- ~ (9) The betrayers were offered silver: S = 16:5 / JC = MATT 26:14-16.
- ~ (10) Samson was blinded by his enemies = 16:5-15 / JC was blindfolded before his cruxifiction = LUKE 22:64.
- ~ (11) Both were mocked by their enemies: S = 16:27 / JC = MATT 27:31.
- ~ (12) Cries for remembrance: Samson cried out to God to remember him = 16:28 / The thief on the cross cried out to Jesus to remember him = LUKE 23:42.
- ~ (13) Their hands "took out the enemy": Samson's hand were placed on the pillars to the left/right of him=16:29 / JC's hands were individually nailed to the left/right = MATT 27:26.
- ~ (14) Their deaths defeated their enemies: S = 16:30 / JC = 1 COR 15:26-27.
- ~ (15) Significance of the Holy Spirit x numbers: $S \times \pm 3000 \text{ killed} = 16:27 / JC's \text{ promised}$ Comforter being poured out $x \pm 3000 \text{ saved} = ACTS 2:41$.

B/S in CJ: To me the above mentioned is the "next" proof that the Bible is indééd the inspired Word of God. The fulfillment of all the types&shadows, cycles & prophecies confirm this. I mean: It is in no human way possible that a Biblical story/incident - that occurred 100's of years ago - could be repeated with/in such meticulous detail, unless the Lord inspired the events and the "writing down" of it!
